UMP signed MoU with Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering

The pupils were participants of a programme called UPSR Empower Edu-Tour and Socio Outreach organised by the Education Development Council (ECERDC) and UMP.

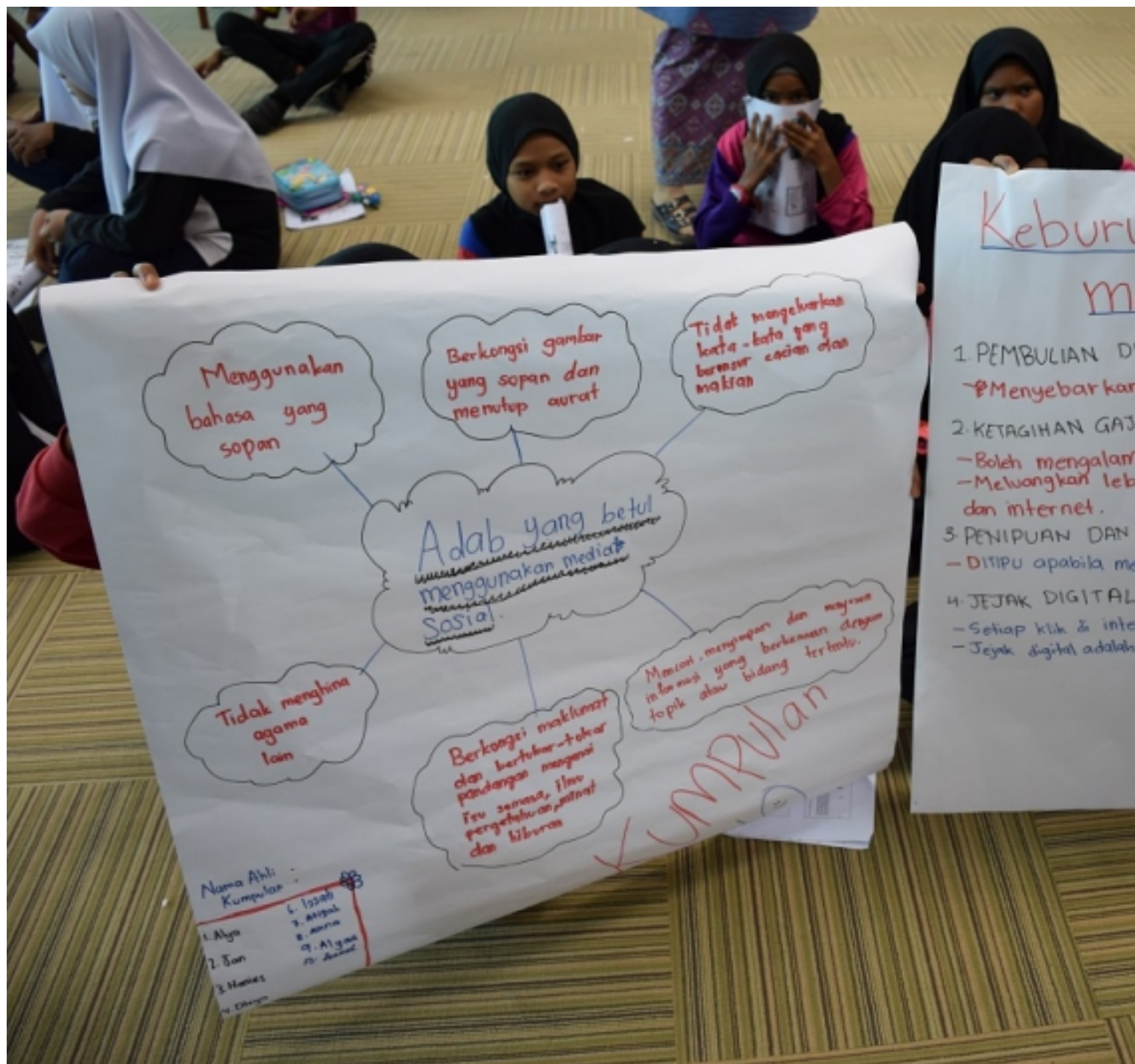


It was held at UMP Pekan Campus on July 17, 2019.
