He also make sure that he attended the class organized by UMP Advanced Education once every fortnight at Manjung, Perak.

"His will and determination serve as a source of inspiration for all of us and we are indeed very proud to have a head of the family that is very positive in facing life challenges" explained Pratibah.

Meanwhile, another graduate for Professional Diploma in Business Management, Shariza Harun, who suffers from SLE, also determined to be present at the fourth session of the 12th UMP Convocation Ceremony that witnessed 685 graduates receiving their scrolls from the Vice Chancellor, Professor Dato' Dr. Daing Nasir Ibrahim.
