Jelajah Prihatin UMP helps Kerdau community

There was also the handover of Yayasan UMP food pack and the delivery of solar lights at the Masjid Kampung Kuala Tekal and Ribath Al-Ba'alawi Kampung Kuala Tekal for use by the residents here.
